SYSTEMATIZING LINCOLN CLIPPINGS (Continued)

The outlines designated A which were presented in Lincoln Lore No. 1179, suggesting how newspaper clip-pings about Abraham Lincoln might be systematized, are brought to a close in this issue under series B. This does not mean that the compliations are presented in does not mean that the compilations are presented in their complete forms because available space has allowed but 400 divisions to be tabulated, while the Foundation files contain 3000 different classifications. In the previous arrangement, data on the "Gettysburg Address" was broken down into a more detailed form for illustrative purposes, and in this issue the section on "Memorials" is given the same treatment.

To further illustrate the extent to which the Foundation files are broken down into smaller units than those indicated in this outline, some of the division caption heads are cited with the number of folders necessary to contain the mounted clippings: Books 1250, Photographs 125, Paintings 140, Sculpture 125, Impersonators 55, Pilgrimages 115. Some of the files more conveniently follow a system for organizing the printed data, alphabetically. We find these approxi-mate numbers of mounted clippings: Editorials 2000, Trib-utes 1800, Poetry 2200, Cartoons 1500, Birthday Celebra-tions 2500, Reminiscences 2300. Of course the clipping files are not associated with personal correspondence, original pictures, magazines or other printed data such as broadsides and reverse sheets. a subject citation.
