LINCOLN BOOK OF THE YEAR-1955

For the past several years there has been approxi-mately a three foot shelf of Lincoln books and pamphlets coming from the press every twelve months. This last year's installment is an average one in the number of sizeable volumes produced and one of them appeared on the best seller list for many weeks.

When the first two volumes of James G. Randall's work *Lincoln the President* appeared in 1945 they were selected by the Lincoln Advisory Committee as the out-standing Lincoln publications of the year. Now that the last volume of the four volume work is from the press with its subtitle, *Last Full Measure*, it is also given the place of distinction for 1955.

Upon the death of Dr. Randall, Richard N. Current took over the task of bringing the manuscript to com-pletion. The text for about half of the volume had been completed and voluminous notes had been gathered for the remainder. Anticipating his departure, Dr. Randall had asked Mr. Current to complete the work and he carried out his assignment in a most excellent manner. The four volume work will be immediately accepted as the most scholarly exhaustive study of the Lincoln administration administration.
