




JEB Stuart - the Eyes and Ears Cavalry Corps Commander




A.P. Hill - the Heart Division then Corps Commander

Lee had previously defeated McClellan at Seven Days. Lee also defeated the Union Army one month before Antietam at the Second Battle of Bull Run.


General Lee advanced from Virginia into Maryland. It was the first time in the war that a Northern state was invaded by the South. Lee wanted:


- Maryland to secede
- To get food for his army
- To get Great Britain to join the war

in a piece of paper that turned out to be Lee's secret battle plans!







The battle started in the morning in a cornfield. The 19th Indiana was one of the regiments involved.








Clara Barton -Union Nurse (later started the **American** Red Cross)

Barton helped wounded soldiers near the cornfield at the beginning of the battle.







The Dunker Church



The Dunker Church Today – Minus the Dead




Jackson's troops fought by the church. They included the 2nd Virginia which was part of the Stonewall Brigade.














End of the battle Burnside Bridge



Northern troops under the leadership of General Burnside tried to cross the bridge.




Burnside senselessly sent brigade after brigade across the bridge to








Civil War Body (found at Antietam in 2008)
