PUBLICATIONS

Lincoln Lore is but one of the many items which the Lincoln Historical Research Foundation has placed in its publishing program. It will be a pleasure for The Lincoln National Life Insurance Company, which established and maintains this foundation, to send many of these contemplated publications, gratis, as it now sends this bulletin, to those who are vitally interested in the life and works of Abraham Lincoln. Some of these publications, however, cannot be given a wide free distribution because the excessive cost would prohibit such a program.

The sale of Lincoln items to individual collectors would involve certain features, which the director of the foundation does not care to associate with his work. With this in view it will be the policy of the foundation to make no provision for the handling of book or pamphlet orders, or the receiving of reimbursements for announced publications. There will be occasions when complimentary copies of items, not distributed generally, will be forwarded in recognition of some special services rendered by the recipients.

Titles which appear to be of permanent historical value will be released through dealers of Lincolniana, with whom this foundation shall be pleased to co-operate in every possible way. In many instances it will seem advisable to issue reprints of magazine articles which the director of the foundation has contributed. These reprints will be published in limited editions, numbered and autographed by the author. Such books and pamphlets as have been written by the editor of this column in years past, may also be secured at the Lincoln bookstalls.

As the main objective of the Lincoln Historical Research Foundation is to sponsor and conduct investigations which anticipate adding to our knowledge of Lincoln, it will be readily understood why it would be unwise to introduce into the activities of the foundation, such routine work as can be handled much more efficiently by others. We shall always be glad to advise those who inquire where the publications of the foundation, to be released through book dealers, may be purchased.
