BIBLIOGRAPHY

Owing to the continually increasing number of books, monographs, and magazine articles about Abraham Lincoln which appear each month, it has been thought best to issue our Lincoln bibliography quarterly. This will allow collectors of Lincolniana to learn of new publications in time to secure first editions. It will also keep Lincoln students in touch with current articles on the subject.

This list in no sense aspires to be an official tabulation of Lincolniana, and many titles may appear which cannot be properly listed in an accepted Lincoln bibliography. Its chief function is to call attention to items which are of interest in this field of investigation. It will also be apparent that many titles have been published about Lincoln during the last three months which have escaped the notice of the editor. If those who learn of new additions to Lincolniana will forward such information as may be used in this compilation, each succeeding quarter the list should become more complete.

Just at present it does not seem wise to list programs, souvenirs, and other Lincoln specialties which are continually being issued, to say nothing of the great bulk of Lincoln calendars which will soon go forth from hundreds of business houses.
