### LINCOLN LIBRARY AVAILABLE

During the past three years the  
Lincoln Historical Research Founda-  
tion has acquired several collections of  
Lincolniana. These have been pur-  
chased to supplement the exhaustive  
library of early Lincoln books and  
pamphlets gathered by Judge Daniel  
Fish which forms the nucleus of the  
foundation's collection.

It was anticipated that many dupli-  
cates would be found in these acqui-  
sitions and they have now been assem-  
bled and classified. This collection of  
Lincolniana contains 425 separate  
items listed in the Fish bibliography;  
575 separate items listed in Oakleaf's  
bibliography; and approximately 350  
different books and pamphlets not list-  
ed in Fish or Oakleaf but following  
their plan of classification.

The foundation is willing to sell this  
collection as a whole, preferably to  
some public institution where it may  
be kept intact. No single volume or  
separate lots have been or will be sold  
under any circumstances.
