LINCOLN BIBLIOGRAPHY

CUMULATIVE

1935

With the release of the next quarterly Lincoln bibliography in this bulletin, ten years will have elapsed since the publication of Oakleaf's and Starr's compilations of books and pamphlets relating to Abraham Lincoln. For the past seven years *Lincoln Lore* has made a careful and complete listing of all new Lincolniana appearing, and it is urged that a Cumulative Lincoln Bibliography for the decade 1925 to 1935 should be brought from the press. Not only will the accumulative method anticipate listing Lincolniana in years to come when other decade volumes may appear, but much work has already been done in compiling and getting ready for publication a chronological arrangement of all known Lincoln items during the past, including those omitted by former bibliographers.

The fact that the Lincoln National Life Foundation owns the collection of Daniel Fish, the first bibliographer to make an exhaustive listing of Lincolniana, has placed upon the foundation the obligation of continuing the work Mr. Fish so ably commenced.

The editor of *Lincoln Lore* appeals to the large list of Lincoln students receiving this publication to make known to him any Lincoln items appearing during the past ten years which are not listed in the quarterly bibliography.

Hodgenville, Kentucky/Birthplace of Abraham Lincoln/(Statue)/Bronze Statue at Hodgenville/The Lincoln Statue at Hodgenville/was erected from appropriations of \$2,500.00 by the State of Kentucky, \$10,000.00 by the Congress of the United States, supplemented by private subscriptions/to the amount of several hundred dollars. It is the work of A. A. Weinmann, of New York, a pupil of St. Gaudens, and was pronounced by Robert T. Lincoln to be a "noble statue" of his father. It was unveiled/May 31, 1909, on which occasion the principal address/was made by Henry Watterson/(Cover title).
