## BUILDING LINCOLN BIRTHDAY PROGRAMS

### DR. WARREN'S CENTRAL STATES SPEAKING ITINERARY

Each year there is arranged for the editor of Lincoln Lore an extensive itinerary which allows him to address many different groups. Two years ago the engagements were scheduled on the eastern coast.
