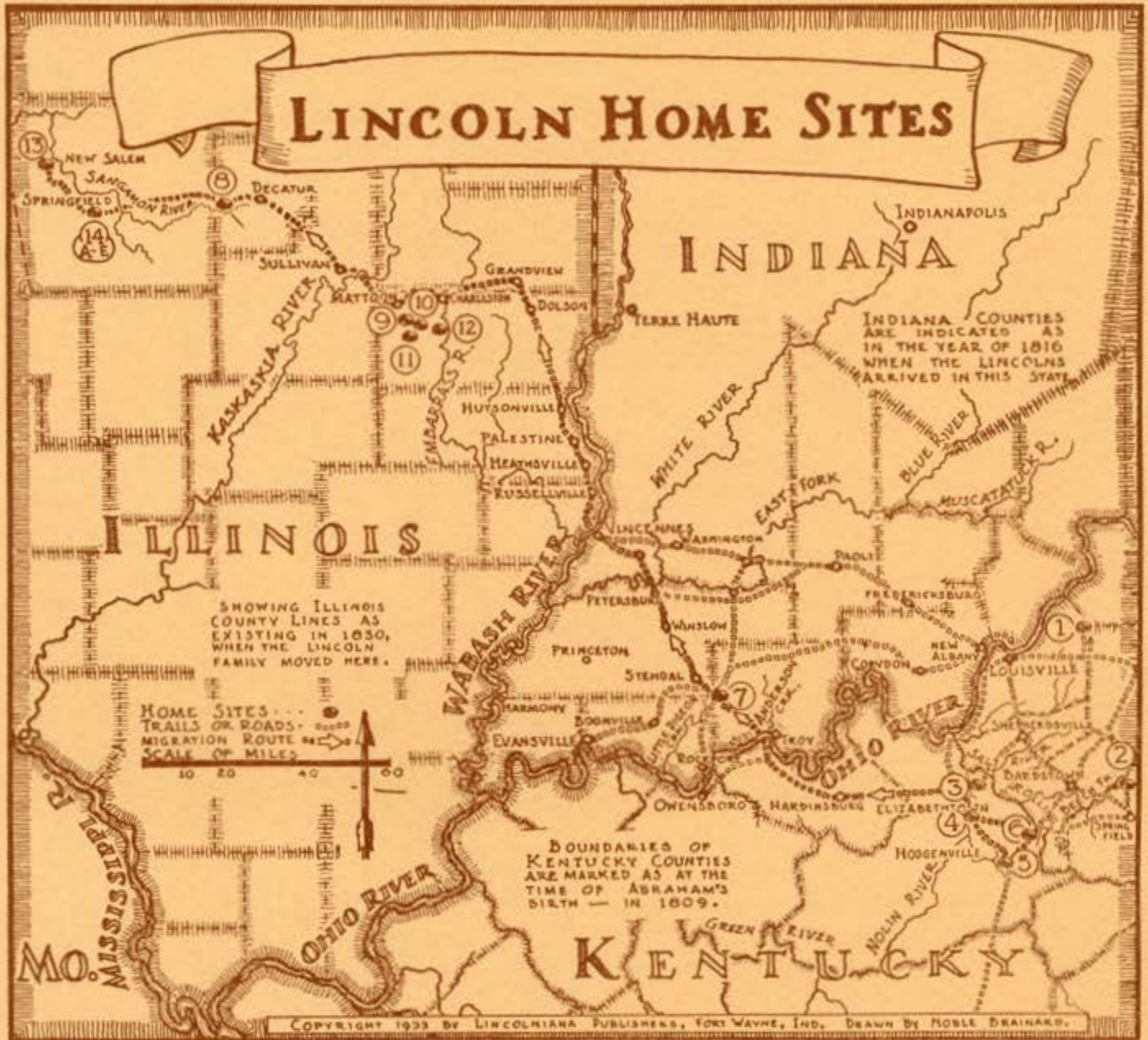

LINCOLN NATIONAL MEMORIAL HIGHWAY

Work is now progressing on the Lincoln National Memorial Highway to such an extent that pilgrimages may be encouraged. Although much of the road is to be built, many will want to visit the Lincoln home sites this summer. A rough outline map is here presented, with a key to the Lincoln home sites and the course of the highway.



Four Early Kentucky Homes of Lincoln's Father

1. Jefferson County, Ky.—1782 to 1786.
2. Washington County, Ky.—1786 to 1802.
3. Mill Creek, Hardin County, Ky.—1802 to 1806.
4. Elizabethtown, Hardin County, Ky.—1806 to 1808.

Four Homes of Abraham's Youth

5. Birthplace, LaRue County, Ky.—Feb. 1808 to May 1811.
6. Knob Creek, LaRue County, Ky.—May 1811 to Nov. 1816.
7. Spencer County, Ind.—Nov. 1816 to March 1830.
8. Macon County, Ill.—March 1830 to July 1831.

Four Late Illinois Homes of Lincoln's Father

9. Buck Grove, Coles County, Ill.—1831 to 1833.
10. Walker's Place, Coles County, Ill.—1833 to 1835.
11. Plummer's Place, Coles County, Ill.—1835 to 1838.
12. Goose Nest Prairie, Coles County, Ill.—1838 to 1851.

13. New Salem, Menard County, Ill.—1831 to 1837.

- 14 C. Globe Tavern—Nov. 1842 to Aug. 1843.
- 14 D. Monroe Street—Aug. 1843 to May 1844.
- 14 E. The Eighth Street Home—May 1844 to Feb. 1861.
