THE FREEDOM TRAIN

For exhibition purposes there has been made avail-able to the American Heritage Foundation by the Library of Congress and other public and private archives a priceless collection of American historical papers. The railroads and industrial units have made it possible to display these documents on a special seven-car train. This traveling display housed in what is termed "The Freedom Train" may be observed in more than three hundred communities embracing curve state in the Union hundred communities embracing every state in the Union.

Press reports on the progress of the train thus far indicate that Abraham Lincoln's Address at Gettysburg seems to have attracted the most attention of the large number of documents exhibited.
