FOURTEEN 1947 LINCOLN BOOKS

Almost a dozen years ago James G. Randall contributed to the American Historical Review a discussion under the title, "Has the Lincoln Theme been Exhausted?" A week ago last Sunday in the magazine section of the New York Times he answered his question of January 1936, with an emphatic No! After having spent several weeks in the recently opened Lincoln papers at Washington he suggests that "a new phase of Lincoln studies has begun." It was encouraging indeed, after having heard many disparaging statements made about the value of the new Lincoln collection in the Library of Congress, to learn from one who is qualified to judge, that the Robert Lincoln gift is "a rich collection with fresh material that is highly valuable from the historian's point of view." It appears as if we are on the verge of a renewed interest in Lincoln which will find expression in many important historical contributions.

The past year has been a normal one in the Lincoln field with about the usual number of cloth bound books appearing, two more than were listed for 1946. A brief cataloguing of these publications follow with sufficient information about author, title, publisher, and price to allow the reader to acquire them if he so desires.

An Anthology arranged in such chronological sequence that it may be classified as a biography to which contributions have been made by many different authors.

Wagenknecht, Edward—Abraham Lincoln His Life, Work, and Character. An Anthology of History and Biography Fiction, Poetry, Drama, and Belles-Lettres. Creative Age Press, New York. Price \$4.00.

An anthology which brings together under one cover exhibits of many different literary compositions as well as different historical viewpoints in dealing with Lincoln data.
