## BEST MAGAZINE ARTICLE — FIRST QUARTER 1948

There were a large number of worth while monographs appearing in various magazines for the first quarter of 1948, which gave the Advisory Group of the Foundation abundant material from which to select the outstanding contribution. First place was awarded David Rankin Barbee for his article in the Abraham Lincoln Quarterly for March entitled, "President Lincoln and Doctor Gurley." Second place choice went to F. Lauriston Bullard for his contribution in the Lincoln Herald for February entitled, "Abe Goes Down the River."
