# IMPORTANT MAGAZINES FOR LINCOLN STUDENTS

Anyone for a few dollars can have a monograph printed in pamphlet form regardless of its historical or human interest value, but the appearance of a contribution in a magazine indicates that it has received the approval of someone else beside the author. The acceptance of a manuscript by any of the better known magazines is in itself a recognition of merit.

Students of Lincolniana would find it of great advantage to acquire a collection of certain magazines which might serve as valuable source material. Such a compilation might be organized in four different groupings: 1st., Restricted Periodicals, confined exclusively to Lincolniana; 2nd., Orientation Magazines, primarily interested in historical data referring to the states or communities where the Lincolns lived; 3rd., Contemporary Publications, containing collateral information necessary to understand the social, economic, religious, educational, and political environs of the day; and 4th., Extended Contributions, consisting of articles of historical significance running through a series of numbers.

While the following tabulation does not aspire at completeness it does outline the possibilities in the periodical field.

### RESTRICTED PERIODICALS

Several magazines and bulletins which are restricted almost exclusively to the Lincoln theme naturally demand first consideration in this compilation. Some are still being published, others have been discontinued.

### ORIENTATION MAGAZINES

Abraham Lincoln lived in three different states, Kentucky, Indiana, and Illinois, before taking up his residence in Washington, and the following magazines contain local atmosphere for recreating the surroundings of the Lincolns in these areas.

There are certain runs of magazines, many pictorial, which are valuable additions to a Lincoln Library in that they allow one to place Lincoln in the routine of current events, and observe the various reactions to him of his contemporaries. The list can be only fragmentary.

#### EXTENDED CONTRIBUTIONS

The editor of McClure's magazine by way of introduction to the Ida M. Tarbell contribution just beginning in his publication made this statement, "It is certainly a remarkable fact that only once before has a magazine undertaken to publish a life of Abraham Lincoln." It is a more remarkable fact that since the Tarbell contribution in 1895 no magazine, with the exception of *The Prairie Farmer*, has attempted a comprehensive biography of the Emancipator, although thousands of books have been written about him.
